Cheyenne has a characteristic tumbled grain pattern which is sanded by hand for a distinctive look. A gorgeous two-tone effect is achieved through a complex, multi-step dyeing technique (known as the sandwich process). Each Cheyenne hide is unique and handmade with love and great care. Natural features such as scarring or distinctive fat wrinkles are quite deliberate as they make each Cheyenne hide very special.

CLEAN & CARE INSTRUCTIONS

Cleaning

Cheyenne is a high-quality aniline leather. Due to the open pores, these leathers are pleasantly warm, but also a little more sensitive to stains. For everyday cleaning, it is sufficient to occasionally dust off the leather with a feather duster or a dry dust cloth.

In the case of fresh stains, first absorb with a dry terry cloth or paper towel by gently pressing with your fingers. Do not rub, this can change the surface irreversibly. Remaining spots can be cleaned with a damp terry cloth, make sure it's not too wet and do not rub too hard. Dry the darkened, wet area with a hair dryer with cold air to avoid water marks. Then sand remaining darkened areas with the **Sanding Pad**. This method can also be used when greasy areas, due to skin or hair contact, are darkened. Always practice a cleaning test in a hidden area first.

For difficult stains, we recommend to contact a specialist before taking any actions. Damage can easily occur due to improper cleaning attempts.

Maintenance and Treatments

For maintenance, we recommend **Aniline Protector**. This treatment provides the necessary moisturizers to keep the leather soft and prevents fading.

In case of risk of stains caused by liquids, we recommend **Water Repellent Spray**.

Depending on the strain, heat, and light exposure, the leather should be sparingly maintained every three to twelve months.
